

Trail Operations Report



August-September 2018

Bently Heritage Trail:

- 1) No activity this period.

Clear Creek Trail:

- 1) The upper section of the Clear Creek Trail has been completed and was opened August 10th. The new upper section of trail is almost 6.5 miles. The Clear Creek Trail is now almost 15 miles long. Signs and maps are now updated on the trail, kiosks and website.

- 2) No significant progress on the Clear Creek Trailhead. Carson City is drafting a grant application to the Forest Legacy Program for fee title acquisition of the entire NDSL property.

Fay-Luther/Jobs Peak Ranch Trail System:

- 1) Qualcon Contractors completed the repaving of 2,500 square feet at the Fay-Luther Trailhead parking entrance. Cost was \$17,000 funded by CVTA.

Genoa Trail System:

- 1) Lower Genoa Canyon, the bridge area in lower Sierra Canyon, and Adams Canyon near the Eagle Ridge TH were cleared of encroaching brush in August.
- 2) The Genoa Loop was walked and routine maintenance completed including brushing, clearing sloughing and rockbergs, and covering up numerous shortcutting routes.
- 3) The upper and middle Sierra Canyon Trail was brushed out and any rocks cleared off. A significant brushing effort was completed on the upper couple miles of trail.

Pinyon Trail:

- 1) Routine tread maintenance on the entire trail was completed in late August.

Miscellaneous:

- 1) Polyflex CVTA logos have now been installed on most kiosks/mileage posts on the trail systems. Additional ones will be installed later.
